

# Shibui Bonsai Catalogue Juniperus chinensis- Shimpaku Feb 2017

Shimpaku are a classic Japanese bonsai species. This variety has tight, slow growing foliage so maintenance is relatively low. Your Shimpaku bonsai stays in shape for longer than most other species.

These junipers are quite slow to develop. It takes a minimum 5 years to get to the stage these trees have reached. Junipers have a habit of stiff, straight growth which can make designing dynamic trunklines difficult. Many of these trees were wired when young to give twisted and curved trunks which should give you the opportunity to develop great bonsai. These trees are ideal candidates for workshops and should give an impressive result immediately.
