## Prunus Elvins

*Prunus* 'Elvins', or Elvins Flowering Plum, originated as a chance seedling in Hawthorn, Victoria, Australia, discovered by Miss Myrtle Elvins around the 1950s and propagated by Reginald Sparks. It's a popular ornamental hybrid, likely involving [\*Prunus cerasifera\*](#) (Cherry Plum), known for its spectacular spring display of white flowers that age to pink, making it a hardy and beloved small tree in Australian gardens.

Makes an absolutely stunning statement as a flowering bonsai in early Spring.

AKA Cherry plum – a plum species hardy enough to become naturalised in cooler areas of Australia. These trees are 'Yamadori' – specimens collected from the Yackandandah area.
